#### **Dexterity Test for School Bus Operators**

**SUBJECT:** Dexterity Test for School Bus Operators

Ensuring student access to educational programs requires that school districts safely transport students to and from school each day. In recent weeks, our office has received numerous inquiries from school districts about the dexterity test for school bus operators, as required by Rule 6A-3.0141(9)(c), Florida Administrative Code. The dexterity testing has changed recently to accommodate larger buses and recent school bus specifications requiring air—operated entrance doors on the buses.

Item 2 of the attached Recommended Guidelines for Administering Dexterity Test addresses the new air door procedure. It begins with the operator seated in the driver's seat with the seat belt on. The operator must get out of the seat, switch the air door switch to the manual position, open the air door, walk down the steps, stand on the ground outside, and close the door.

A 65-passenger bus or larger can now be used for Item 4 of the dexterity test regarding the ability to exit the bus in an emergency. On larger rear engine buses, the operator may exit the side door, but the same procedure for exiting would be followed. To prevent injury, operators should always sit and slide out the exit. A cushioned pad should be placed on the ground outside the emergency door for this portion of the test.

The attached recommended guidelines are intended to assist Florida's public school districts and charter schools in administering required dexterity testing of school bus operators. District transportation personnel are encouraged to follow these guidelines.

School bus operator training instructors or other supervisory level employees such as lead drivers or lead driver/trainers should administer the test. It is recommended that all testing be administered using a standard bus type and configuration. The buses used should meet the following criteria:

- Late model 65-passenger capacity or larger
- Non-lift equipped
- Manual or air operated door control
- The operator's seat should be adjustable for the full range of movement (up, down, forward, and backward).
- The rear and/or side emergency door buzzer must be operable.
- The emergency door must be capable of being fully opened.

Districts should consider borrowing or purchasing an Instructo Timer (trademark) or similar testing device to administer Item 3 relating to operation of pedals and reaction time.

Regarding the simulated evacuation (Item 4) in a 65-passenger bus, the operator must exit the rear door; in a larger transit style bus, the applicant must exit the side door. The operator must exit the bus without the use of an aid, such as steps, ramps, etc. The school district should use a cushioned pad on the ground for the operator to exit safely.

For Item 5, each operator should travel a predetermined route. The ideal route would include the operator demonstrating a student loading or unloading procedure and crossing a railroad track.

The operator must successfully complete all of the five items on the dexterity test. If an operator has difficulty passing one or more of the five items, the examiner should retest the particular item(s) on which the operator performed unsatisfactorily. The operator should be afforded every opportunity to demonstrate the ability to pass all components of the dexterity test.

It may be desirable to test all operators on Items 1- 4 during the same time period and then schedule individual appointment times to administer Item 5.
